Patient Code of Conduct

To maintain a professional, safe environment for all patients, caregivers, and staff, the following details conduct which must be exhibited by all persons who enter the dispensary:

- <u>Physically present</u> an unexpired Medical Marijuana Identification Card and a valid state identification card, Driver's License, passport, or other form of identification approved by the Ohio State Board of Pharmacy at each visit.
- Do not distribute, sell, or share your cannabis products. Doing so violates local and state laws.
- Be kind. Any inappropriate action or language is cause for being asked to leave the dispensary.
 Repeated offenses will result in a permanent refusal of service. Do not conduct yourself in a disruptive, offensive, or belligerent manner towards employees or patients while in the dispensary.
- For the protection of our patients' privacy, and for security reasons, no photography or video recordings are permitted in the dispensary.
- No food or beverages may be consumed on the sales floor during hours that cannabis is being dispensed, unless necessary for medical reasons.
- No loitering outside of the dispensary before or after completing a transaction.
- Do not operate a vehicle or heavy machinery while impaired by medical marijuana.
- No onsite consumption. The use of medical marijuana on dispensary premises (including the parking lot) is illegal and strictly prohibited pursuant to Ohio Code 3796:6-3-22 (G).
- Do not open any cannabis product package in the dispensary.
- Do not enter the dispensary impaired and unable to operate a vehicle without a designated driver/caregiver
- Patient transactions will be denied if any illegal activities are alluded to or suspected during the time of sale.

Disclosure and Assumption of Risk Agreement

This Acknowledgement of Disclosure and Assumption of Risk Agreement has been prepared to provide you with information regarding the risks and side effects of using medical marijuana. It is important that you read this information carefully and completely. Please discuss any questions you may have your certifying physician.

Possession or use of this product is unlawful outside of the State of Ohio and prohibited by federal law. Medical marijuana may have intoxicating effects and has not been analyzed or approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration ("FDA") and was produced without FDA oversight for health, safety, or efficacy.

The efficacy and potency of medical marijuana may vary widely depending on the medical marijuana strain and delivery method. When products infused with medical marijuana or active compounds of medical marijuana are eaten or swallowed, the intoxicating effects of this drug may be delayed by two or three hours or more. There is limited information on the side effects of using medical marijuana, and there may be associated health risks.

Side effects of medical marijuana can include, but are not limited to, memory loss, anxiety/nervousness, dry mouth, irregular/increased heartbeat, sexual impotence, numbness, low blood pressure, agitation, confusion, hunger/loss of appetite, dizziness/impairment of motor skills, cough/bronchitis/shortness of breath, dependency, depression, impaired vision, feelings of euphoria, laryngitis/bronchitis/general apathy, drowsiness/fatigue/abnormal sleep, headache/nausea/vomiting, sedation/slower reaction time/inability to concentrate paranoia/psychotic symptoms, suppression of the immune system, allergic reaction. Symptoms of medical marijuana over-consumption include, but are not limited to, nausea, vomiting, and disturbances to heart rhythm.

The scientific basis for the medical use of medical marijuana is still being established. There is a limited amount of information regarding how medical marijuana may or may not react with other pharmaceutical or herbal medications.

Some patients can become dependent on medical marijuana. This means they experience withdrawal symptoms when they stop using medical marijuana. Signs of withdrawal symptoms can include feelings of depression, sadness or irritability, restlessness or mild agitation, insomnia, sleep disturbance, unusual tiredness, trouble concentrating, and loss of appetite. Some users can develop a tolerance to medical marijuana. This means higher and higher doses may be required to achieve the same symptom relief.

The possibility exists that medical marijuana may exacerbate schizophrenia or bipolar disorder in persons predisposed to those disorders.

Women should not consume medical marijuana products while planning to become pregnant, during pregnancy, or while breastfeeding, except on the advice of the certifying health practitioner, and in the case of breastfeeding mothers, on the advice of the infant's pediatrician.

Keep out of the reach of children and pets. Using medical marijuana while under the influence of alcohol is not recommended. The use of medical marijuana may affect coordination, cognition, and judgement. While under the influence of medical marijuana, do not drive, operate machinery, or engage in potentially hazardous activities.
